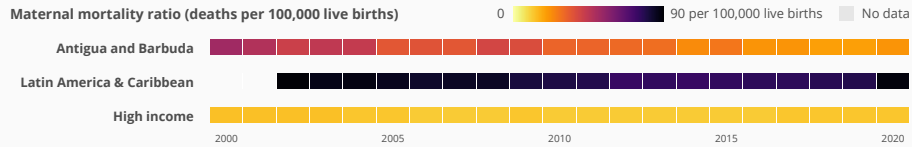


21 women die per 100,000 live births due to pregnancy-related causes in Antigua and Barbuda

The maternal mortality ratio in Antigua and Barbuda has improved from 51 in 2000 to 21 in 2020. Maternal mortality in Antigua and Barbuda is lower than its regional average. Maternal mortality ratio is the number of women who die from pregnancy-related causes while pregnant or within 42 days of pregnancy termination per 100,000 live births.

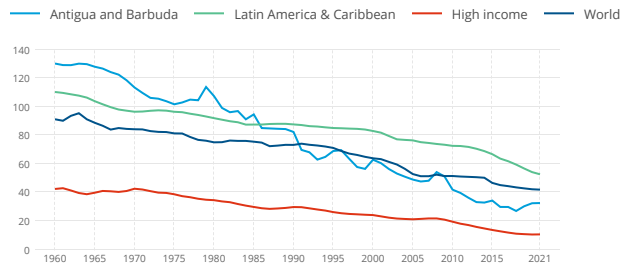

In Antigua and Barbuda, the rate of adolescent fertility has decreased since 2010. The rate in 2021 was higher than the average rate in its income group.

111.9% of girls and 115% of boys complete lower secondary school in Antigua and Barbuda as of 2019 data

Girls and boys in Antigua and Barbuda have a very high completion rate of lower secondary school. Lower secondary education completion rate measures how many children have completed the last grade of lower secondary education regardless of age completed.

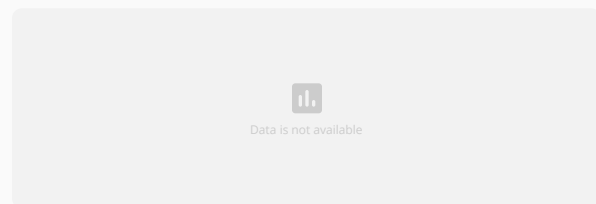

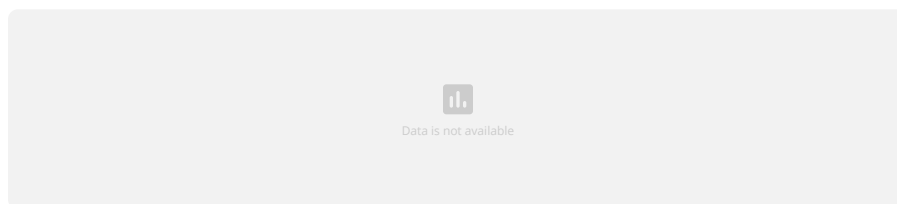

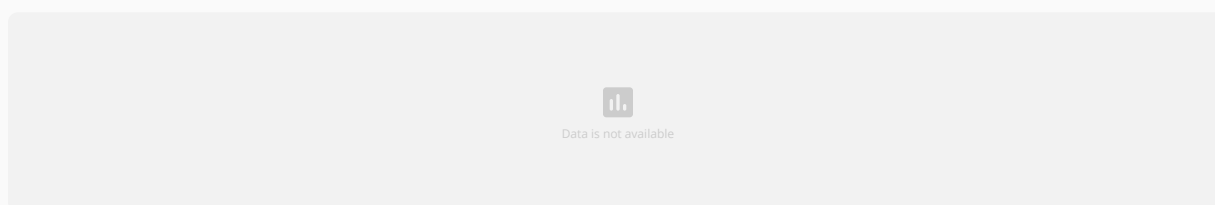

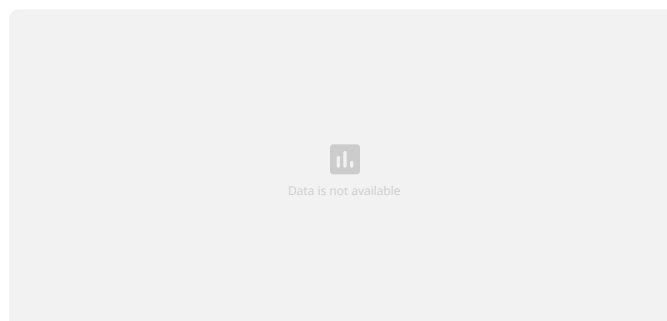

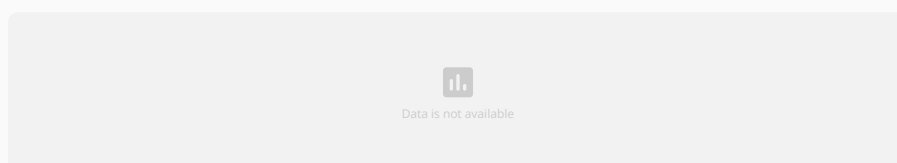

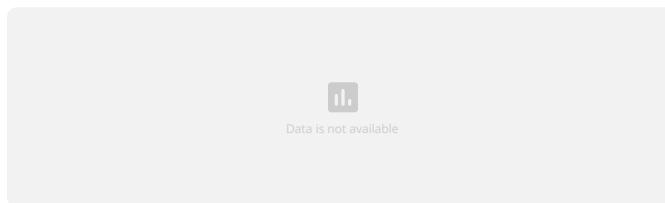

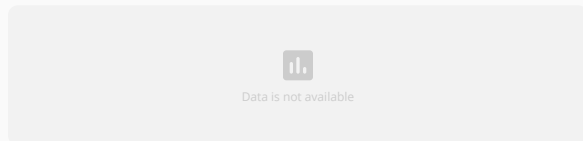

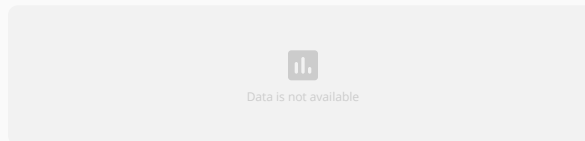

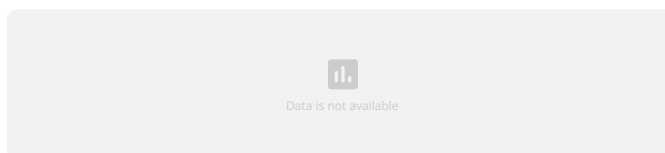

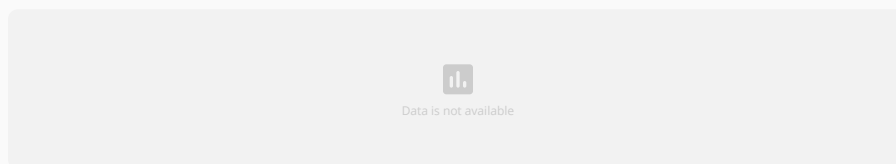

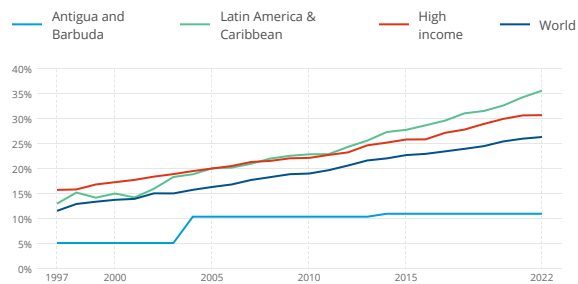

11.1% of seats in national parliament were held by women in 2022 in Antigua and Barbuda

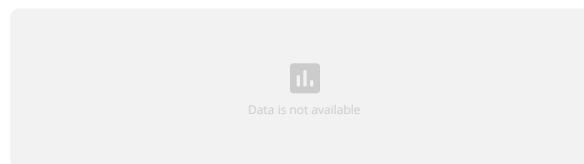

Seats held by women in national parliaments, female (%)

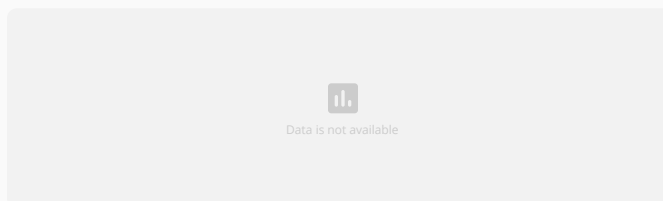
